Jane and Simmonette Interview

Nicola and Anna from Royce Rolls

Jane and Sim from the News Flash Team went out to interview Nicola and Anna of Royce Rolls.

Jane: What type of fillings do you do? And what things do you sell?

Anna: We do salad, you can order anything from the list. We always do salad with the rolls but you can order whatever you like, 2 different types of filling if you like. We also do a mixture of different types of sandwiches and rolls, white, brown, wholemeal and French stick/baguettes.

We also sell fresh fruit chocolate, drinks and crisps.

Sim: How often do you work?

Nicola: I work 1 morning a week and that is every Tuesday. There are different people who work each day. We have a rota.

Anna: I work on a Tuesday morning every week. I also work at Westgate House on a Monday and Wednesday.

Sim: What time do you start work in the morning?

Anna: I start work at 9.00 am with Royce Rolls. I get up at 8.00 am for my Westgate House job and on my college course day I get up at 7.00am.

Sim: What time do you finish?

Nicola: I finish about 12.00 noon.

Anna: 12.00 O'clock. We always clean up, do the floor load the dishwasher ready for work the next day.

Sim: How do I get a job with Royce Rolls

Nicola: People that want to work for Royce Rolls can contact Westcombe industries 01733 746343 and talk to Steve Ball or someone from the team and say they have got an interest to work. Sometimes they can get help to apply through a referral by a Social worker, carer or a day centre officer. Someone could help you from your circle of support or someone who is at your review meetings like a review officer.

Jane: Do you enjoy working at Royce Rolls?

Nicola: Yes I really enjoy it. We start in the morning go and get the orders from people at work or an order comes in on the phone for an event/meeting or something like that. We go and buy the food we need that morning come back make sandwiches and deliver. We work hard and enjoy it. We have to be reliable and not let people down. People rely on the service we do and that is good.

Anna: Yes I like it very much. I enjoy working getting up and being busy. We do good work and people have called to tell us what a good job we do and how much they like our sandwiches and service.

Jane: How did Royce Rolls start?

Nicola: People that work at the Fountain Bar, (a café run by people with learning disabilities at the kingfisher centre in Bretton) Wanted to do more work and Royce Rolls was set up by people with learning disabilities as part of the cafe idea. They are based at Westcombe Industries, it was a good place to run our kitchen. We have to be very good with health and safety. There is a course at the Peterborough Regional College on a Friday Anna goes to this course, it trains you in kitchen and health and safety skills when cooking and preparing food. This course is in the **Green Book** and it is called 'Cookery for Independence'.

The Green Book shows you college courses for people with a learning disability in Peterborough.

David: They are normally 3 months or so. The next one is Thursday 28th April.

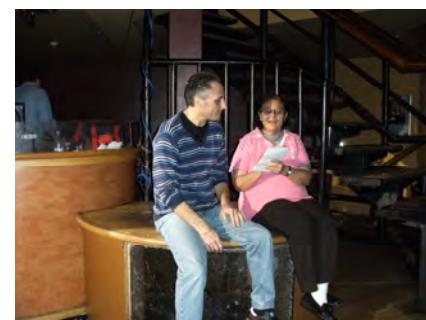
Fatma: Do you like going?

The first Lava Lamp night was in July 2007. Darren Ferguson Posh football manager opened the night by cutting a ribbon. There was an article in the Evening Telegraph launching the club.

Fatma: Tell us about the work-shops?

Enzo: There are DJ workshops, Art workshops and steward work-shops. The DJ workshops are very popular this is where you train to be a DJ. The DJ's bring their own music. There is a great mix of music on the night. The Art workshops are 2 full days with an arts tutor. The team make Art to decorate the club so that the club is colorful on the night. We have themed nights and create Art around the theme. Steward workshops train people to do volunteer work on the night. They learn about how to keep themselves and others safe, how to spot someone in trouble that is worried or upset on the night and how to help them. This is a very important job and helps to make the night safe and fun for all.



Fatma: What time is the Lava Lamp and how do people get home?

We open the club night at 8pm and close at 1am in the morning and then when we finish we make sure everyone is out of the nightclub safe and we make sure they have a taxis or someone picking them up and supporting them. We have emergency contacts for everyone in the club. When people buy their tickets we write down their details so that we can help to make the night safe for everyone.

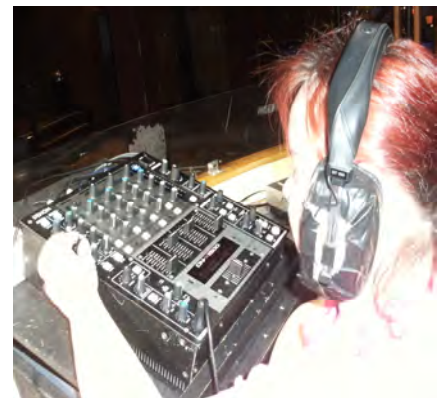

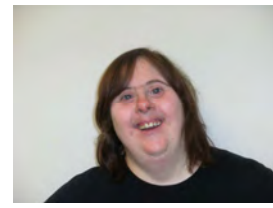

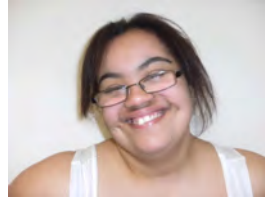
