

Sue Ryder will be launching the first community Grief kind space in central Peterborough at the start of 2024. Sue Ryder's aim is to create a safe space bringing diverse cultural groups together.

People who are grieving have said that they would find it helpful to meet and talk to others who have also been bereaved. Facilitated by trained volunteers, Grief Kind Spaces are informal community drop ins, providing an opportunity for people who are grieving to share their feelings and experiences with each other. Sue Ryder understands that everyone grieves differently, and want to offer support in the way that works best for them.



 Improving Lives Fundng: Free Legal Advice for Marginalised Communities, Deadline 15th January 2024


Charities Can Apply for Funding to Provide Free Legal Advice for Marginalised Communities (England) Organisations that deliver free specialist social welfare legal advice to marginalised people and communities can now apply for grants of up to £500,000 over five years.

The funding is being made available through round two of the Improving Lives Through Advice programme which is supported by the National Lottery Community Fund. To be eligible, an organisation must be:

- registered with the Charity
 Commission and working in England
- able to demonstrate a track record of delivering legal advice to people who need it most, such as people with disabilities, women fleeing abuse and families facing eviction
- able to demonstrate a track record of supporting access to advice services, e.g. this could be through involvement in a health justice partnership, having an established referral pathway to advice services or co-location of services with advice agencies

Priority will be given to organisations:

• working outside of London and operating in the East of England, West Midlands, and Northeast England

• led by and for marginalised communities and/or groups of people The level of funding available depends on the applicant organisation's annual income. The deadline for expressions of interest is 4pm on the 15th January 2024. Arts on Prescription | Referral Programme, Starting 24th January

Arts on Prescrition is a friendly inclusive 12-week programme (29th January - 29th April) for adults experiencing mild to moderate mental health challenges such as anziety, depression or stress. Facilitated by a professional artists and qualified counsellor you will explore different are materials in weekly workshops at Peterborough Museum and Art Gallery. No previous arts experience required but you will need to be referred by a GP or Social Prescriber.

Peterborough Cultural Alliance | Be Heard Survey, Briefing 24th January

The Be Heard survey will go out in February asking people how they engage in creative and cultural activities. The survey will go to every household in Peterborough in February 2024. It will capture information about people's perceptions of cultural activity in the city, how they are engaging in it, where and the impact on their lives.

The survey is anonymous. The results will be placed on an online site where organisations and individuals can use it to help their cultural programmes, gain evidence to support funding bids. It will help to shape cultural programming in the city to ensure everyone has the chance to take part in activity that is relevant to them. As this survey will be repeated in 2 years' time, it will also act as a baseline against which we can measure our progress at Peterborough Cultural Alliance.

The survey will be incredibly useful to the city and hopefully to you but it needs us all to encourage people to complete it so that we hear a diversity of voices - not just the usual suspects, and not just those that already go to the theatre etc. You might be involved in the media, a community champion or a partner who can help us reach a new audience.

These briefings are a chance to find out more, ask questions and see how, together, we can help get the word out. Please do come along. Doing this survey is only as good as the people we reach with it and we would love for


PCVS Future Forum: Making the Case for Peterborough, 16th January
